#### GREAT START TO AUTUMN TERM

Like most people these days, they are looking ahead to see if the school can maintain its financial equilibrium with the cost of living increases as the school only has finite resources. Good communication between school and home is essential for all children and all parents should have received a Parentmail and ClassDojo link. The different

methods of communication can be very confusing, so we wanted to make it clear that the ClassDpjo system is purely for parents to share the praise their child is

receiving in class and for the parent and teacher to discuss any concerns they have about the learning in class.

Class Dojo should not be used to inform the school of any administrative tasks such as a child's absence, medical appointments, your child being picked up by someone else, ordering school equipment such as ties, these areas should all be communicated directly to the school office, either by email to Reception@thaxted.essex.sch.uk or by phone on the school number 01371 830240

#### ROAD SAFETY

It has been so lovely for Mrs Crompton to meet everyone outside the school, but she has been watching the safety of children coming into school in a morning and she has been assessing the parking situation. Not surprisingly the availability of parking spaces is not good, she will be contacting Essex Highways to see if the road markings can be repainted and the school will be purchasing temporary bollards to go outside the school to make it safe for children crossing, so they do not have to pass through parked cars.

Also some children are being dropped off and then walk into school unaccompanied, this generally is not a problem if the child is aged 10 or older, as they learn a sense of responsibility ready for secondary school.



But if this happens when the gates are closed it is not appropriate for a lone under 10 year old child to wait without an adult.

Please can parents try their best to avoid this situation, if something was to happen, staff at the school may not
